Web Service. Our new optional service allows teachers to posts reports and messages on our web site. Parents and students access their information using password protected accounts. Free for four months with new purchases, then \$18.00 per year.

Web Service subscribers will also be able to use the Class Action mail server for email, giving AOL and other users with non-standard email servers access to Class Action's email capability.

Major Advantages

Security:

Class Action is not "web based." Student grading and attendance information is stored on your computer or your school network, not the word wide web. Class action provides password protection for data stored on you computer.

Our optional Web Service allows teachers to select what information (if any) is to be posted on the web.

Class Action automatically creates backups of your class files. Backups of the last four times the program was used are saved.

Ease of Use:

Wizards take you step by step through the creation of a new class.

Changes in class size, structure and grading system can be made at any time.

Once a your first class is set up, Class Action's Clone and Begin New Grading Period commands allow easy creation of new classes and grading periods. Names, points, or averages can be automatically carried forward.
